WHAT IS THE OPPORTUNITY?

This is an opportunity for a leadership team from your district to participate in a facilitated pilot program to learn how to implement best practices that build and sustain collaborative processes and systems for student-centered, shared decision-making.

During this program, your team will:

- Have full access to NEA's online learning course "Collaborating for Student Success" and all of its accompanying tools and learning resources
- Participate in live, virtual cohort sessions with other districts from around the country facilitated by CEC experts
- Engage in live, virtual coaching sessions directly between your district and CEC

WHO SHOULD BE ON A DISTRICT LEADERSHIP TEAM?

District teams must include at least one district administrator and the education association/union president (or their designee). Beyond that, you are encouraged to assemble a diverse team of district leaders representing a wide range of perspectives. For this program, team size is limited to 10 people per district.

WHAT IS THE INVESTMENT FOR MY DISTRICT?

The base investment to participate is \$2125 per district. As a demonstration of its commitment to collaboration, NEA is offering a **sponsorship of \$265 for each NEA member** on a team.


